



Deacon's Corner Act of the Apostles

During the Octave of Easter and continuing into the seventh week of Easter, the first readings at daily mass are from the "Acts of the Apostles." The Acts of the Apostles is believed to have been written by St. Luke. This book describes how the Spirit of God guides the Apostles in their ministries. The Risen Jesus tells His Apostles, "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8). The Holy Spirit inspires their preaching, tells them where to go, and aids them in making decisions.

The Acts of the Apostles is composed of 28 chapters. Chapters 1 through 7 describe the preaching of the Apostles and the growth of the Christian community in Jerusalem. Chapters 8 through 12 focus on the growth of the Church in Judea, Samaria, and Syria. Chapters 13 through 28 emphasize the expansion of Christianity to "the ends of the earth," especially. to Asia Minor, Greece, and Rome (Father Felix Just, <u>https://catholic-resources.org/Bible/Acts.htm</u>).

Like the Apostles, we are encouraged by the Holy Spirit to continue to share the love of Jesus and the Good News with all that we meet. The Acts contain many valuable lessons; they remind us that God is always with us and to trust in Him. This week, let us go to the Acts of Apostles in the Bible and read a passage(s) and prayerfully reflect on its meaning(s) for our lives.

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY - by Rev. William J. Reilly Most Holy Name Catholic Church, Garfield, NJ

Fifth Sunday of Easter May 7, 2023

"Brothers (and Sisters) select from among you seven reputable men filled with the Spirit and wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task, whereas we shall devote ourselves to prayer and the ministry of the word... They presented these men to the apostles who prayed and laid their hands on them. The word of God continued to spread, and the number of the disciples in Jerusalem increased greatly..."

As you read this passage from the Acts of the Apostles, consider your parish, your faith sharing group, your own community. What happened in Jerusalem was part of God's plan then, and it is God's plan for us now. There was a need, and a choice, for something new was so necessary. Prayer, discernment and action followed.

The same process is not limited to those called to be deacons. Some years ago we found many involved in Catholic Action, people responding to their baptismal call, not to maintain the church or parish, but to evangelize and grow in faith and numbers. Allow others to know Jesus who said He is THE way and THE truth and THE life. 'No one comes to the Father, except through me.'

May our group, our parish, our society live these words. Yes, like Philip in the gospel today, we say 'Master show us the Father and that will be enough for us.'
