A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY

Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time August 27, 2023

"He asked his disciples: 'Who do people say that the Son of Man is?' They replied, 'Some say John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' He said to them, 'But who do you say that I am?' Peter said in reply: 'You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

The all important question as we speak about Jesus. In our world we find people describing Jesus in so many ways. People have their opinion – teacher, Son of Mary or the carpenter's son. He is the miracle worker, the visiting preacher in the synagogue. 'What a friend I have in Jesus', He is the just judge. All are correct descriptions. They tell us about Jesus.

Today He asks me – who am I for you? Pause for a moment and think about your answer before you presume or speak. The final answer is: Jesus Christ is my personal Savior, and without Him there is little meaning in my life. As Peter made his response and was blessed by the Lord, so my response seeks His grace and blessing. Tell someone else who Jesus is for you, and like Jesus, ask who Jesus is for them.

First Reading: Isaiah 22:19-23

This passage refers to the use of authority and indicates the Key as the symbol of authority. The words "open" and "shut" refer to the power that will eventually be given to Peter.

Second Reading: Romans 11:33-36

Paul writes ecstatic and praise-filled words about God's plan for his people. In him, he writes, "all things are."

Gospel: Matthew 16:13-20

When Jesus asks his disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" Peter exclaims, "You are the Messiah!" Christ then declares that Peter is the "Rock" upon which he will build his Church, promising him the power "to bind" and "to loose."

Deacon's Corner

The feast day of St. Augustine, Bishop and Doctor of the Church, will be celebrated on Monday, August 28, the date of his death. He was the son of St. Monica and was born in North Africa. He studied in the city of Carthage where he excelled in rhetoric and philosophy.

In his early life, he spent his time in worldly vices, but there was a dramatic spiritual change in his life. Through the prayers of his mother, St. Monica and the preaching of St. Ambrose, Augustine accepted Christianity. He was baptized by Ambrose at the age of 33.

As he embraced the Catholic faith, St. Augustine committed to spending the rest of his life as a servant of God. He pursued a monastic life in prayer, work, and study of the Holy Scripture. After three years, he was ordained a priest. In the city of Hippo, he assisted the bishop and later succeeded him as the head of this diocese. He served 35 years as bishop. St. Augustine wrote several famous works, *The City of God*, which confronted the belief that the fall of the Roman Empire was due to the spread of Christianity. The other famous work is entitled, *Confessions*, which is his deeply personal and humble autobiography.

On this day, may we pray, "St. Augustine, please pray for me, that I will discover what you discovered and imitate your conversion, holding nothing back from our merciful God. Jesus, I trust in you."
