Mother Cabrini's Eucharistic Devotions – This Week, November 12th, 13th & 14th

Guest speaker will be Fr. Brad A. Milunski, OFM Conv., who is originally from Amsterdam, NY. He studied philosophy and Franciscan studies at St. Hyacinth College and Seminary in Granby, MA, and received a Master of Divinity degree from Washington Theological Union in Washington, DC. In 1989 he professed final vows as a Conventual Franciscan friar, was ordained to the priesthood in 1993, and served for three years in parish ministry. From 1996 to 2000, Brad studied in Rome, Italy, at the Pontifical Biblical Institute and was awarded a Licentiate in Sacred Scripture in 2000. After further Brad served in the post-graduate studies, interprovincial ministry of initial formation in

Indiana. the greater Washington, DC area, and in Chicago. From 2010 to 2014, Brad was pastor of Assumption Church Syracuse, NY. From 2014 to 2018 he served as the Vicar Provincial for the Our Lady of the Angels Province. Currently, Brad is pastor of St. Stanislaus parish in Chicopee, MA.

Obituary for FR. ROMULUS (LEONARD ANTHONY) ROSOLOWSKI, OFM CONV. 1946 – 2023

Fr. Romulus (Leonard Anthony) Rosolowski, OFM Conv., 77, a Franciscan Friar of Our Lady of the Angels Province, passed away peacefully on Saturday, October 28, 2023 at Mercy Hospital in Buffalo, NY. Born in Buffalo on September 15, 1946. he was the eldest son of the late Leo and Florence (nee Zielinski) Rosolowski. After graduating from Bishop Ryan High School in 1964, he entered the Novitiate of the Conventual Franciscans in Ellicott He completed his undergraduate studies at St. Hyacinth College Seminary in Granby, MA, during which time he professed solemn vows on August 15, 1968. After earning a Bachelor's degree in 1969, he traveled to Rome, where he studied at the Pontifical Faculty of Saint Bonaventure ("the Seraphicum") until 1973. He completed his M.Div. at St. Anthonyon-Hudson Seminary in Rensselaer NY in 1974. He was ordained to the priesthood on May 11, 1974. His first assignment as a friar-priest was to the high school apostolate, teaching at Cardinal O'Hara between 1974-1976. He then served as Associate Pastor of Corpus Christi parish in Buffalo, until 1979, when he requested to work in the province's mission in Ghana. He served in West

Africa from 1979-1983. The remainder of Fr. Romulus' ministerial priesthood was spent in parochial settings: St. Francis of Assisi, Hamburg NY (1983-86); St. Casimir, Baltimore MD (1986-91); Pastor of St. Paul Church, Atlas PA (1991-94); Administrator of St. Stanislaus Kostka, St. Michael. St. Mary parishes, Shamokin PA (1994-95); Co-Pastor of St. Paul, Kensington CT (1995-96); Pastor of Holy Family, St. Casimir & Emerich, and St. Columba parishes near Hooverville, (1996-2005): a second stint at St. Francis in Hamburg (2005-2008); Our Lady of Victory Basilica, Lackawanna NY (2008-2023).

Fr. Romulus is survived by his siblings, Robert (Kristin) Rosolowski, Sr. M. Rosalind Rosolowski, CSSF, Dennis Rosolowski, David (Patricia) Rosolowski and like a brother to Mark Yourdon; also survived by loving nieces and nephews Thomas (Jessica), Natalie, Wade (Kathryn), Chelsey (Justin), Hannah (Erik); great nephew Parker; cousins, parishioners, many friends and the Conventual Franciscan Friars.

Deacon's Corner

The memorial for St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, known as Mother Cabrini, will be celebrated on Monday, November 13. She is the patron saint of our parish. Frances Cabrini, one of thirteen children, was born in 1850 in the small village of S'ant Angelo Lodigiano near the city of Milan, Italy. Early in her life, she desired to join a religious order.

With seven women, Mother Cabrini found the Institute of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. They wanted to be missionaries for the people of China, but in an audience with Pope Leo XII, he encouraged her "not to the East, but to the West" and to go to New York City. There were many Italian immigrants in the United States that she and her sisters were to serve.

The sisters began to organize catechism and education classes for the immigrants and to provide for the needs of the orphans as they established schools and orphanages. Mother Cabrini received requests to establish schools in America, Central and South America, and Europe. Under her guidance, the sisters built 67 schools, hospitals, and orphanages. Today, the sisters serve as teachers, nurses, and social workers in 17 countries.

Mother Cabrini died in Chicago in 1917 and was canonized a saint by Pope Pius XII in 1946 as the Patroness of Immigrants. On this day, may we pray, "Lord, by Mother Cabrini's example, teach us concern for the stranger and the sick and help us to see Christ in all people we meet."


Gospel Today
