Deacon's Corner

The Memorial of the Guardian Angels

The Memorial of the Guardian Angels will be celebrated on Monday, October 2. This memorial was first observed by the Franciscan order in 1500 A.D. In 1615, Pope Paul V added it to the Roman calendar. These guardian angels are special angels of God to watch over each of us and to protect us from danger from birth to death. "Angel" in Greek means messenger. In unseen ways the angels help us on our earthly pilgrimage by assisting us in work and study, helping us in temptation, and protecting us from physical danger (CatholicCulture.org).

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that "the existence of the spiritual, non-corporeal beings that Sacred Scripture usually calls 'angels' is a truth of faith (328). Beside each believer stands an angel as protector and shepherd leading them to life (336)." In Matthew 18:10, Jesus' words support the belief of angels assigned to protect and guide us, "See that you do not despise one of these little ones, for I say to you that their angels in heaven always look upon the face of my heavenly Father."

On this day and all days of our lives, may we pray, "Angel of God, my guardian dear, to whom God's love commits me here, ever this day be at my side, to light and guard, to rule and guide. Amen."
