

Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time August 20, 2023

"Observe what is right, do what is just; for my salvation is about to come, my justice, about to be revealed. The foreigners who join themselves to the Lord, ministering to him, loving the name of the Lord, and becoming his servants. Them I will bring to my holy mountain and make joyful in my house of prayer...for my house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples."

Deacon's Corner

The Memorial of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary will be celebrated on Tuesday, August 22, on the octave day of the feast of her Assumption. In 1954, Pope Pius XII established the feast of the Queenship of Mary. In his encyclical *Ad Caeli Reginam*, he proclaimed, "We are instituting a feast so that all may recognize more clearly and venerate more devoutly the merciful and maternal sway of the Mother of God. Is she not a rainbow in the clouds reaching towards God, the pledge of a covenant of peace?"

Vatican II reaffirmed this doctrine of Mary's Queenship, "When her earthly life was over, she was exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son" (*Lumen Gentium*, 59). Assumed into heaven body and soul, she sits at the right hand of her Son, Jesus Christ, where she intercedes for each one of us so that we may share in her Son's Heavenly Kingdom. The coronation of Mary as "queen of heaven" emphasizes the destiny that God wants for each of us – the full participation in the glory of heaven.

On this feast day, may we pray, "Grant, we beg you, O Lord, that we who celebrate the feast day of the Blessed Virgin Mary, our Queen, may merit, under her loving protection, to attain peace on this earth and glory in heaven. Through Christ our Lord. Amen."


