Religious Education Classes



First Reading: Isaiah 55:6-9

Isaiah expresses an urgent plea that all should seek the Lord and turn to him for mercy.

Second Reading: Philippians 1:20c-24, 27a

In a strongly personal message from Paul while in prison, he says that he wishes "to be freed from this life and to be with Christ," but he realizes that he still has much important work to do.

Gospel: Matthew 20:1-16a

Jesus tells the parable of the owner of an estate who hires workmen for his vineyard. When, at the end of the day, he pays a full day's wage to those who worked only one hour, those who worked all day complained bitterly. But the owner says, "I am free to do as I please, am I not?" Jesus reminds us through this parable that "the last shall be first and the first shall be last."

Deacon's Corner

The Memorial for St. Vincent DePaul, Priest, will be celebrated on Wednesday, September 27. St. Vincent, born in 1581 in Landes, France, was ordained a priest in 1600. In his parish ministry, he worked tirelessly for those in need, the sick, the poor, and the abandoned. His motto was, "God sees you." St. Vincent founded the religious congregation known as the "Vincentians" to preach missions, undertake charity work, and establish seminaries. Also, with the support of St. Louise de Marillac, he helped to establish the Congregation of the Daughters of Charity, now known as the Sisters of St. Vincent. These sisters dedicated themselves to those in need in hospitals, soup kitchens, prison ministry, orphanages, and job training.

St. Vincent DePaul is the patron saint of charitable societies and workers, hospitals, and hospital workers. On his feast day, may we pray, "Saint Vincent de Paul, you were called by God to serve the poor, sick, and many others in need. You drew many others into this service through your work in forming the clergy, religious sisters, and laity to be instruments of God's love. Please pray for us, that we will more fully devote ourselves to a life of compassion, and that we will make the proclamation of the Gospel our central mission in life. Saint Vincent de Paul, pray for us. Jesus, I trust in You." As we honor this saint on this day, may we find ways to love and care for our neighbors who are in need in charitable ways.

Jesus compares the Kingdom of <u>Heaven</u> to the vineyard - the <u>rewards</u> are <u>equal</u> for all regardless of when the workers begin, or the faithful respond to the call of Jesus.

The <u>landowner</u> went out at dawn to hire workers. The <u>first</u> workers <u>agreed</u> on a daily wage. Later in the day the next <u>workers</u> agreed to a <u>just</u>, or fair wage. The <u>last</u> workers only worked 1 hour. Though all the workers started at different <u>times</u>, the landowner paid them the same. Upon <u>receiving</u> the same daily wage, the workers who were in the <u>vineyard</u> all day were <u>envious</u>. The landowner said, "Take what I promised and go. I am <u>free</u> to be <u>generous</u> with my money."
