NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: 1 Kings 19:9a, 11-13a

After fleeing from the revenge of the King of Israel, Elijah hid in a cave, but at the command of God, he went outside and stood on a mountain. There the Lord came to him, not in the wind nor in the earthquake, but in a "tiny whispering sound."

Second Reading: Romans 9:1-5

Paul is deeply pained because the Jews - in spite of everything that has been given to them - have rejected Christ.

Gospel: Matthew 14:22-33

Matthew vividly recounts the event of Jesus walking on the water. When the disciples see this, they are terrified, and Jesus chastises them for their fear. Peter begs Christ to let him walk on the water; he is at first brave but begins to sink and loses faith, crying out, "Lord save me!" Christ rescues him for his faltering faith.

Deacons Corner

The Memorial of St. Maximilian Kolbe, OFM, Conv. Priest and Martyr, will be celebrated on Monday August 14. With devotion to the Blessed Mother, Father Kolbe founded the Immaculata Militia, which is an evangelization movement devoted to the Virgin Mother. By his early thirties, Fr. Kolbe established a religious community called "the city of the Immaculata" near Warsaw to expand this effort. Starting with a few friars, it grew to house of nearly 800. He also constructed a monastery near the city of Nagasaki, Japan.

During World War II, he was arrested by the Nazis and taken to the Auschwitz concentration camp. In July, 1941, one of Kolbe's fellow captives escaped. In retaliation, ten men were chosen to be executed. One of the men begged not to be killed, as he had small children. The soldiers remained firm until Kolbe volunteered to take his place. They were led to an underground bunker, where they were left to starve to death. After two weeks, four men were left alive, and Kolbe was the only one conscious. The four were killed by lethal injections on August 14, 1941. His remains were cremated on August 15, the same day as the Assumption of Blessed Virgin Mary feast day. Canonized in 1982, St. John Paul II declared him as "the patron saint of our difficult century."

May we pray, "Jesus, may we give ourselves to the love and service of our Heavenly Queen in order to better serve our sisters and brothers in imitation of your servant, St. Maximilian."
