Call the parish office to place your order(s). Don't delay phoning . . . , there is a limited production run for both "flavors."


Calling All Our Pierogi Makers!!!

Deacon's Corner

The feast of St. Matthew, one of the Twelve Apostles and the Evangelist, is celebrated on Tuesday of

this week. In the Gospel on this feast, Jesus "saw a man named Matthew sitting at the customs post. He said to him, "Follow me." And he got up and followed Him." (Matthew 9: 9) St. Matthew was a tax collector. In this time period, tax collectors were viewed by the people as dishonest and greedy individuals. As Jesus calls him, Matthew abandons his position and becomes a disciple of Christ. He was close to Jesus and was one of the authors of the first book of the four Gospels. There is little else known about the life of St. Matthew. St. Matthew is the patron saint of bookkeepers and bankers.

The life of St. Matthew is an example of why Jesus came into our world. He comes to save all that are lost; those who have sinned. When the Pharisees see Jesus with St. Matthew and other tax collectors and sinners; they ask the disciples, why does your teacher eat with these people? Jesus overheard their question and replies, "Those who are well do not need a physician, but the sick do. I desire mercy, not sacrifice. I did not come to call the righteous but sinners." (Matthew 9:11-13) Our Savior comes to call each of us in His love and mercy to obtain the fruits of eternal salvation through Him.

On this feast, may we pray, "St. Matthew, in your Gospel you portray Jesus as the longed-for Messiah who fulfilled the Prophets of the Old Covenant and as the new Lawgiver who founded a Church of the New Covenant. Obtain for us the grace to see Jesus living in His Church and to follow His teachings in our lives on earth so that we may live forever with Him in heaven."
