Deacon's Corner

The Memorial of St. Aloysius Gonzaga will be celebrated on Friday, June 21. He was born of a noble family in northern Italy and grew up in royal courts and in military camps. His father wanted him to enter into a career in the military. Throughout his life, he was known for his love of daily prayer and fasting. St. Aloysius suffered from various illnesses such as kidney problems, headaches and insomnia during his life.

St. Aloysius renounced his inheritance and entered the Jesuit novitiate. He wrote, "It is better to be a child of God than king of the whole world." Aloysius spent four years studying philosophy at the seminary and St. Robert Bellarmine was his spiritual advisor. In 1591, a plague and famine occurred in Rome. The Jesuits opened a hospital in the city to help the people infected with the plague. Aloysius was one of the individuals who volunteered to nurse the sick, make their beds and wash them. Soon he contracted the disease. Three months later, he died at the age of 23.

St. Aloysius is the patron saint of students, young people, AIDS patients and caregivers. He is often invoked against eye troubles and epidemics. On this day, may we pray, "Lord, help us to be like Saint Aloysius, who gave up honor and riches to serve you. Keep us untouched by the spirit of this world, so that we may seek your glory in all things. Amen" (Joseph Tylanda, *Jesuit Saints and Martyrs*).

Sensory Friendly Mass

In an effort to embrace and welcome the members of our church with Autism, Downs Syndrome and development disabilities, Our Lady of Hope will begin hosting a Sensory-Friendly Liturgy once a month. These Masses include lower lights, softer music and shorter, more literal homilies; however, the biggest difference is that we try to create an environment that is welcoming and non-judgmental to all. We encourage families and individuals to get up and move, if needed, to bring alternative seating, fidgets or noise cancelling headphones and to participate in the liturgy just as they are.

Our first Sensory-Friendly Mass will be on July 14 at 2:00 PM with fellowship to follow.
