#### **Deacon's Corner**

On Monday, November 11, the Memorial of St. Martin of Tours, Bishop, will be celebrated at daily mass. St. Martin was born in 316 A.D. in present day Hungary

and raised in Italy. He began to study about Christianity at an early age. As a young man, he served in the Roman army as a cavalryman. Yet, he

desired a higher purpose in his life. Martin helped a shivering beggar in France by giving half of the cloak he wore to him. He later had a vision in which Jesus was wearing the cloak he gave the beggar. St. Martin immediately became baptized and refused to fight the invading Francs on the basis of his conscience.

As a Christian missionary, he began to preach the Gospel throughout the region and serve the poor and the sick. This humble man was chosen by the people of Tours as their bishop. He reluctantly accepted and as bishop he established over 3,500 churches and founded the Benedictine abbey at Liguge, the oldest known abbey in Europe.

St. Martin's life shows us that we are to welcome Christ in the neglected and those who are on the fringes of our society.
