### **Deacon's Corner**

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity is celebrated on Sunday, May 26. In St. Matthew's Gospel, Jesus proclaims to the Apostles, "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy

Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (28: 16-20).

The Holy Trinity is a central mystery of our Catholic faith. God reveals Himself as Father, Son and the Holy Spirit. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* states, "The Trinity is a mystery of faith in the strict sense, one of the 'mysteries that are hidden in God, which can never be known unless they are revealed by God' '" (237).

The doctrine of the Holy Trinity includes "three truths of faith." The first truth is that the Holy Trinity is One. There is one God and the unity of each Person is one divine nature. The second is that the Divine Persons are "distinct from one another" and "are in relation to one another." The third truth is that the Father cannot 'be the Father without the Son, nor can the Son be the Son without the Father. The Holy Spirit is related to the Father and the Son who both send him forth" (*U.S. Catholic Catechism for Adults*, 2006, 52-53). On this day may we pray, "The Father is my hope. The Son is my refuge. The Holy Spirit is my protector. Glory to the holy and undivided Trinity, now and forever,"
