

#### **Deacon's Corner**

#### Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

This Sunday, December 29, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. On this feast day, we offer our families to God for His blessing and His protection. The Holy Family provides a beautiful example to inspire and encourage us in our daily life.

As the "domestic church," we look to the Holy Family as a model family in which both parents worked hard, helped each other, understood and accepted one another as God's gifts, and raised their Son in human and divine wisdom. The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds all parents that we have a **responsibility to give good examples to our children as the Holy family did, by creating a home where love, tenderness, forgiveness, respect, and service are the rule (CCC, 2223).** 

On this day, may we pray for God's grace to care for one another in our families, and for our parish family, "Jesus, Mary and Joseph, in you we contemplate the splendor of true love; to you we turn with trust. Holy Family of Nazareth, grant that our families too may be places of communion and prayer, authentic schools of the Gospel and small domestic churches. Holy Family of Nazareth, make us once more mindful of the sacredness and inviolability of the family, and its beauty in God's plan. Jesus, Mary and Joseph, graciously hear our prayer. Amen. #### A Biblical Walk Through the Mass

Through the Mass, we encounter God in the most intimate way possible as we hear him speak to us in the Liturgy of the Word and as we receive him Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Holy Eucharist. In his video-based program, *A Biblical Walk Through the Mass*, Dr. Edward Sri explores the roots of the words and gestures we experience at Mass and explains their significance. This study of the Mass will renew your faith and deepen your love for the Holy Eucharist.

#### Jubilee Year

The year 2025 will be a Jubilee Year, as proclaimed by Pope Francis. A Jubilee Year is traditionally proclaimed by the Universal Church every 25 years. It is a particular year set aside to encourage the faithful to embark on pilgrimages, to repent of their sins and forgive the sins of others, and to renew a focus on the spiritual life. In the Hebrew tradition, as recorded in Leviticus, a Jubilee was celebrated every 50 years with the freeing of slaves and the forgiveness of debts. In 1300, Pope Boniface VIII instituted the first Christian Jubilee, and since then the Church has designated each new Jubilee as a special year of grace and forgiveness, offering the faithful an opportunity to obtain a plenary indulgence.

On December 29 2024, the Diocese of Harrisburg will hold a special opening Mass at the Cathedral of St. Patrick. Attendees will gather at the St. Lawrence Chapel and process to the Cathedral for Mass.

**Jubilee Indulgence:** Special graces for the forgiveness of sins are made available during the Jubilee Year. The faithful may obtain a plenary indulgence – remission of all temporal punishment (time in Purgatory) for sin– by meeting the normal conditions (confession, Holy Communion, prayer for the pope's intentions, and no attachment to sin) and by participating in one of the following activities:

- **Pilgrimages:** The four major basilicas in Rome
- are the main pilgrimage destinations, but pilgrims may also go to the Holy Land, their diocesan cathedral or other officially designated locations.
- **Pious visits to sacred places:** At these locations, the faithful are to engage in Eucharistic adoration and meditation, among other spiritual practices.
- Works of mercy and penance: The faithful are to perform the spiritual or corporal works of mercy or carry out works of penance, such as abstaining from meat on Fridays.
- Holy Doors: The pope opens the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica at the beginning of each jubilee year. Passing through the holy doors symbolizes the pilgrim's journey of conversion.
- **Papal Basilicas:** The pope will open the Holy Doors of the four main churches (called "major basilicas") in Rome: St. Peter's Basilica, St. John Lateran, St. Mary Major, and St. Paul Outside the Walls.
