# December 22, 2024 Fourth Sunday of Advent

### First Reading: Micah 5:1-4a

### **Gospel: Luke 1:39-45**

# Deacon's Corner Fourth Week of Advent

During this final week of Advent, we prepare our hearts to celebrate the Nativity of Lord on Wednesday, December 25. In His overflowing love, God the Father sends His Son into our world to free us from sin and death.

In 1293 on Christmas Eve, St Francis of Assisi assembled the first crib in a cave on an Italian hillside in Greccio near the town of Assisi. The crib was ready, hay was brought, and the ox and the donkey were led to the spot. St. Francis wished to make the Christmas story come alive for the people. His idea was to show them how present and close Our Savior was to them.

The friars and the people assembled with candles around the crib. St. Francis spoke to the people, who were mainly farmers and shepherds. He proclaimed that God's Son came among us to teach us that we too are God's children, and we have an eternal destiny. They accepted the message that God has a deep love for all people. At the end of the vigil, they all returned to their homes filled with joy in their hearts, feeling close to Our Lord and to one another.

This same message is true today. Our Newborn Savior is present and lives with us in our daily lives – in the Holy Sacraments, Holy Scripture, and in our faith community. We too are to be bearers of Christ – to share His love and kindness with people we meet in our lives.
