#### **DEACON'S CORNER**

The Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles will be celebrated on Saturday, June 29. This liturgical feast day celebrates the martyrdom in Rome of both apostles. Saint Augustine of Hippo explains, "Both apostles share the same feast day, for these two were one; and even though they suffered on different days, they were as one. Peter went first, and Paul followed. And so, we celebrate this day made holy for us by the apostles' blood. Let us embrace what they believed, their life, their labors, their sufferings, their preaching, and their confession of faith."

These simple and humble men responded to God. Jesus called them to perform marvelous works of faith - works that they would never have imagined. They became pillars of the Church. St. Peter represents the office of the Vicar of Christ. When Our Savior meets Peter, Jesus proclaims, "I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven (Matthew 16: 18-19).

Over a ten-year period of time, St. Paul became a missionary and evangelized throughout the Mediterranean region. He spread the Good News to many people and served as the first theologian of the Church through his writings. On this feast day, may we pray, "Lord, may we hear your call of what you wish us to do and respond by our actions to your will like Saints Peter and Paul."

## A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY

### Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time June 23, 2024

"A violent squall came up and waves were breaking over the boat, so that it was already filling up. Jesus was in the stern, asleep on a cushion. They woke him and said to him, 'Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?' He woke up, rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, 'Quiet! Be still!' The wind ceased and there was great calm. Then he asked them, 'Why are you so terrified? Do you not have faith?' They were filled with great awe and said to one another, 'Who is this whom even the wind and sea obey?'"

Saint Mark paints a beautiful picture of a crisis and opportunity for Jesus to respond. He does care that we are perishing when we walk away from Him. He is not asleep, but waiting for us to turn to Him. Some might take the scene and say this is the stormy world we are living in. Jesus do you not care? Others might think that the crisis in the church today fits the same description. Sexual abuse, scandal, criticism certainly do not make the picture appealing.

Jesus does care. Do I do my part to still the wind and calm the sea of discontent? He asks me, why I care, why I am terrified or if my faith provides the direction the Spirit of God is leading us. I need to awaken. The Chinese use two picture characters to describe a crisis – danger and opportunity. May we calmly take advantage of the teaching and opportunity.
