
St. Jude Novena

Deacon's Corner St. Pope John Paul II

The optional memorial of St. Pope John Paul II will be celebrated on Tuesday, October 22. St. John Paul II was born Karol Jozef Wojtyla in 1920 in Wadowice, Poland. After being ordained a priest in Poland, he became an auxiliary bishop. In 1964, he was selected as the Archbishop of Krakow and participated in the Second Vatican Council.

Archbishop Wojtyla was elected pope, the 263rd successor to St. Peter, in October 1978 and took the name John Paul II. Pope John Paul II led the initiatives in the creation of the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) and the Code of Canon Law for the Latin Church and for the Eastern Churches. In a missionary spirit, he met and greeted millions of people in his papal ministry. He also attracted young people to the Church by beginning the celebration of World Youth Day.

Lech Walesa, the first President of Poland after the fall of Communism, credited St. John Paul II with giving the Polish people the courage to demand change. Pope John Paul II encouraged a spiritual and cultural resistance to the Communist occupation of Poland, giving the people hope in the face of oppression.

Pope John Paul II passed on to eternal life on Saturday, April 2, 2005, the vigil of Sunday of Divine Mercy Sunday, which he had instituted. He was canonized by Pope Francis on April 17, 2014. There is a national shrine dedicated to St. John Paul II in Washington, DC. On this day, may we reflect about one of his quotes, "The more ready you are to give yourself to God and to others, the more you discover the authentic meaning of life."
