DEACON'S CORNER

The Memorial of St. Benedict, Abott will be celebrated on Thursday, July 11. He was born in the small town of Norica in central Italy in 480 AD. He was the twin brother of St. Scholastica, the foundress of the Benedictine sisters. Distressed by the immorality of Rome, St. Benedict left and became a hermit in Subiaco. Soon, his spirituality and miraculous works attracted many followers.

After 25 years of living in Subiaco, he left this monastery due to disturbances and the jealousy of local clerics. Benedict took a small group of monks and went to Monte Cassino where he established a monastery. He remained there for the rest of his life. It is here that he wrote the famous "Benedictine Rule," which is the text that was followed in monastic life in the West. It was a guide for a life of prayer, study, manual labor, and living together in community under an abbot.

On the final day of his life, March 21, 547 AD, St. Benedict asked to be brought to the chapel. He received the Body and Blood of Christ in the Holy Eucharist. As he said his last prayer, he died, standing in the chapel, supported by his fellow monks. He was buried next to his sister, St. Scholastica, at the Abbey of Monte Cassino.

St. Benedict wrote, "Listen carefully, my son and daughter, to the master's instructions, and attend to them with the ear of your heart." As Jesus' followers, may we love and listen to Our Lord more fully in the spirit of St. Benedict.
