

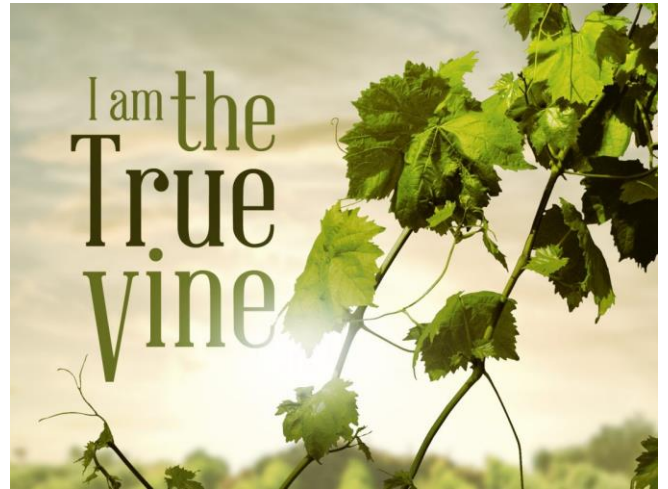

April 28, 2024 FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

First Reading: Acts 9:26-31

Paul the Apostle came to Jerusalem, where the other disciples were afraid of him. Then they learned that the Lord had spoken to Paul and he had preached openly in Damascus. When they learned that someone wanted to kill him, they protected him because they fully believed he had converted.

Second Reading: 1 John 3:18-24

John clearly states that we must love one another. All people who believe in Jesus Christ can show their faith only through their actions. If people believe in Jesus and love one another as he commanded us, they prove that they are true believers in Christ.

Gospel: John 15:1-8

Jesus compares himself to a vine, and compares his father to the vine-grower. He explains how God prunes the barren branches so that the rest might yield more fruit. He reminds them that apart from himself, his followers could not bear fruit.

Deacon's Corner

The Memorial of Saint Catherine of Siena, Virgin and Doctor of the Church, will be celebrated on Monday April 29. St. Catherine entered the Dominican Third Order at the age of 18. The Third Order was composed of lay people who lived at home and worked in the world. They served the poor and the sick. For the first several years, Catherine lived mostly a life of seclusion and prayer.

Later, she began an active ministry helping the poor, sick, and imprisoned in Siena, Italy. When the Bubonic plague struck Europe, St. Catherine and her companions cared for the people affected by this disease. St. Catherine wrote many letters and prayers to kings, queens, and government officials. During her last two years in Rome and the Great Schism in the Church, she worked for the unity of the Church under Pope Urban VI.

One of her greatest gifts to the Church was her written work, "The Dialogue of Divine Providence." It is a conversation between a soul and the Father in Heaven. St. Catherine and St. Francis of Assisi in 1939 were declared co-patrons of Italy. Pope Paul VI also named her and St. Teresa of Avila doctors of the Church in 1970. St. Catherine is the patron saint of Italy, nurses, and the sick. She is often invoked against miscarriages, fires, and temptations.

On her feast day, may we pray, "My Father, my sweet Lord, help me in all my actions. Jesus, love. Jesus, Love. Amen."
