Deacon's Corner

Memorial of Saint Paul Miki and Companions, Martyrs

The Memorial of Saint Paul Miki and Companions will be celebrated at daily mass on Thursday, February 6. This feast day honors the 26 Martyrs of Nagasaki who died for their faith in 1597. The Catholic faith reached Japan by the 16th century through the efforts of St. Francis Xavier. The Franciscan missionaries also came to Japan to evangelize the people.

In 1597, tensions began to occur between these missionaries and the leaders of Japan. Hideyoshi, the ruler or Japan, enforced an edict outlawing Christianity and arrested 26 Catholics - six Franciscans, seventeen Japanese and Korean lay Franciscans, and three Jesuits. Brother Paul Miki and the others were arrested, tortured, and marched 600 miles over 30 days through villages so the people would be dissuaded from becoming Christian.

When they reached Nagasaki, the center of Christianity, they were allowed to go to confession one last time. Then, they were chained to their crosses and stabbed to death by the solders' lances. During this ordeal, St. Paul Miki professed that Jesus is the only way to salvation, forgave his persecutors, and prayed that they would turn to Christ.

Over the next 250 years, Christians were martyred and tortured. Despite this persecution, pockets of Catholics secretly practiced their faith in Japan. In 1871, religious tolerance returned and public worship occurred. On this day, may we pray, "Holy Martyrs of Nagasaki, pray for me, that I will have the same faith and courage that each one of you had, so that I will be a witness to Christ in all that I do."
