DEACON'S CORNER


The Memorial of Saints Cornelius, Pope, and Cyprian, Bishop, Martyrs

The Memorial of Saints Cornelius, Pope and Cyprian, Bishop and Martyrs will be celebrated on Monday, September 16. Cornelius of Rome and Cyprian of North Africa are third century saints who were martyred for their love of Jesus Christ and His Church. They are commemorated together on this feast day because they were friends and allies. We hear both their names prayed in Eucharistic Prayer I during Mass.

In 251 A.D., Cornelius was chosen as Pope over the objection of Novatian, who claimed the papacy for himself and was the first antipope. St. Cyprian traveled to Rome to be part of a synod of bishops which upheld Cornelius' authority as Pope and excommunicated Novatian and his followers. The Roman emperor Gallus arrested Pope Cornelius and placed him in prison where he died of physical hardships. St. Cornelius is the patron saint invoked against earaches, epilepsy, and fevers.

St. Cyprian was born in North Africa in 200 A.D. He was an accomplished lawyer and orator. He converted to Christianity and was ordained a priest. He battled many heresies and promoted Church unity. Cyprian was arrested under the persecution of the emperor Valerian, condemned to death, and beheaded on September 14, 258. He was the first African bishop to suffer martyrdom and is the patron saint of North Africa and Algeria.

On this feast day, we pray, "May the prayers and faith of Saints Cornelius and Cyprian give us courage to work for the unity of God's Church."



TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 50:5-9a

Isaiah describes the willingness of the Suffering Servant to submit to the persecution of his enemies. This willingness stems from true faith in God, and the knowledge that the Lord will always be his help.

Second Reading: James 2:14-18

James states that if some one is hungry and you wish them well but do not help them, you have done them no good. He compares this to stating your faith, without backing it up with your actions. He reminds us that we must show our faith through our good works.

Gospel: Mark 8:27-35

Jesus taught his disciples that as the Messiah, he had to suffer much, be put to death, and rise three days later. Peter began to disagree and Jesus reprimanded him for judging by human standards rather than by God's. He told them that whoever would be willing to lose their life for the sake of Jesus and the gospel, will in fact preserve their life forever.

Sensory Friendly Mass

A Sensory Friendly Mass will be held at Our Lady of Hope Church this Sunday, September

15th at 6PM. These Masses include lower lights, softer music, and shorter more literal homilies; however, the biggest difference is that we try to create an environment that is welcoming and nonjudgmental to all. We encourage families and individuals to get up and move if needed, to bring alternative seating, fidgets or noise cancelling headphones and to participate in the liturgy just as they are.
