Third Sunday in Ordinary Time January 26, 2025

First Reading: Nehemiah 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10

Ezra gathered the people and read to them from the book of the Law of God. He interpreted the law clearly, so that everyone understood what he had read. He then told them to go and rejoice in the Lord.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:12-30

Paul explains that a body is composed of many different parts, and that each part has its' own purpose and is important. He compares this to the Church, describing how we are one body composed of many members. All members should show concern for each other and understand that we are all vital to the body as a whole.

Gospel: Luke 1:1-4, 4:14-21

Luke discusses his decision to write about the events he and the other disciples had witnessed. He begins by telling of Jesus reading a passage from the book of Isaiah, where the anointed one is portrayed. Jesus finished by telling the people that they had seen that passage fulfilled in their hearing.

Deacon's Corner

The Memorial of Saint Thomas Aquinas, Priest and Doctor of the Church, will be celebrated on Tuesday, January 28. St. Thomas, a member of the Dominican friars, lived in 1200's and died in his 40's. He was one of the great intellects in the world. He was given the titles "Doctor of the Church and Angelic Doctor" because of his philosophical and theological knowledge and understanding.

During his brief life, he produced a library of works defending and explaining the Catholic faith. These written works remain a pillar of Catholic theology. His mind was so remarkable that he could write several books at the same time. While one secretary wrote down a paragraph, he would dictate another paragraph for another book to a second secretary keeping both of them writing for hours.

Tradition tells us that before he died, he was praying in a chapel, kneeling beneath a large wooden crucifix. The sacristan heard a noise and peeked into the chapel. He saw our Lord appear to the saint and say to him: "You have written well of me, Thomas. What reward would you have?" To which Thomas replied, "Nothing but yourself, Lord." This statement reflected his life. He was doing everything not for his own glory, but for Jesus Christ. May we pray, "Grant me, O Lord my God, a mind to know you, a heart to seek you, wisdom to find you, conduct pleasing to you, faithful perseverance in waiting for you, and a hope of finally embracing you. Amen." (Prayer written by St. Thomas)
