

and some of our Mother Cabrini parishioners have moved to warmer climates for the winter months, please remember that Mother Cabrini Parish still depends



THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

First Reading: Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7

Isaiah tells of the Lord's Servant, who will be inconspicuous, but will not rest until justice is established. The Lord then tells his servant that he was formed to be "a light for the nations."

Second Reading: Acts 10:34-38

Peter speaks to a group of pagans for the first time. He explains to them that any person who follows God's will is acceptable to God, regardless of nationality.

Gospel: Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

John the Baptist had claimed one would come far more powerful than himself, one who would baptize with the Holy Spirit rather than water. When Jesus came to John and was baptized, the Spirit descended on him and a voice said, "You are my beloved Son. On you my favor rests.



Deacon's Corner First Week of Ordinary Time

During this First Week in Ordinary Time at the daily masses, the Gospel of St. Mark describes four miracles that Jesus performs to heal the sick and those in need. In the Gospel at Mass on Tuesday, we hear about the healing of a man with an unclean spirit; on Wednesday, Simon's mother-in-law is cured of a fever; on Thursday, a leper is made clean; and in Friday's Mass Gospel a paralytic's movement is restored.

The Gospel of St. Mark describes 18 miracles and healings that Jesus performs in His public ministry. These signs clearly show Jesus' identity and power as the Son of God and the Messiah who was promised by God. Through these signs, we experience how Jesus acts in love and mercy on a daily basis with people. In Saturday's Gospel, we hear, "That some scribes who were Pharisees saw that Jesus was eating with sinners and tax collectors and said to his disciples, "Why does he eat with tax collectors and sinners?" Jesus heard this and said to them, "Those who are well do not need a physician, but the sick do. I did not come to call the righteous but sinners."

Ultimately, this is the reason that Jesus comes into our world – to heal each one of us and to call us to Himself. This Gospel foreshadows His ultimate sacrifice on the Holy Cross for the redemption of our sins and for our eternal salvation. In gratitude, may we pray every day, "Thank you Lord for your unending love and mercy."
