A solemn novena for St. Jude Thaddeus, an Apostle and Patron Saint of Hope and Hopeless Causes, will be held at Our Lady of Hope Church, 863 West Chestnut Street, Coal Township beginning on Sunday, October 20 to

Monday, October 28 (9 consecutive days). The novena will begin at 6:30 p.m. each evening. On Saturday, October 26, Most Reverend Timothy Senior, Bishop of Harrisburg Diocese, will be the celebrant at the 4 p.m. Mass. There will be a closing mass on Monday, October 28. On the other nights of novena, there will be prayers, a brief reflection, music, and the veneration of the true relic. Please join us. All are welcome.

Deacon's Corner - Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus, Virgin and Doctor of the Church

On Tuesday, October 1, the Memorial of Saint Therese of the Child Jesus will be celebrated at Mass. St. Therese was a cloistered Carmelite sister known as "the Little Flower." She was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope John Paul II in 1997 and is one of four women who are Doctors of the Church.

Born in 1873, she was raised in a model Catholic family. Both her mother and father, Zelie and Louis, were also canonized in 2015. St. Therese formally entered the convent at 15 years of age. For the next nine years, she lived a holy and quiet life in the convent.

During this time, Therese wrote her autobiography, *The Story of a Soul*. In this work, she writes about her life as a child, her call to religious life, her love of family and about the way in which she understands Christian discipleship. St. Therese described her spirituality as "the Little Way." It is based on doing little with great love. In this way, we must love and place our trust in God, love our neighbors in our actions, and strive for holiness in our daily lives

St. Thérèse is the patroness of all foreign missions, missionaries, AIDS sufferers, and the patroness of France. Her statue stands in the front garden of Mother Cabrini Church. On this feast day, may we pray, "St. Therese, help me to always believe as you did in God's great love for me, so that I might imitate your "Little Way" each day.

Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Numbers 11:25-29

Two men not considered prophets by the people began to prophesize, and this offended those who did not feel they were true prophets. But Moses explained that prophets are chosen by God, not the people.

Second Reading: James 5:1-6

James speaks out strongly against people who become rich by cheating their workers. He claims the wealth they have dishonestly collected will be a testimony against them on judgment day.

Gospel: Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

Jesus explains to his disciples that it is acceptable for a person who is not part of their group to speak in his name, but he does warn them that anyone who tries to lead his followers astray will be severely punished. Jesus also discusses personal failing and the importance of taking whatever steps are necessary to avoid them
