

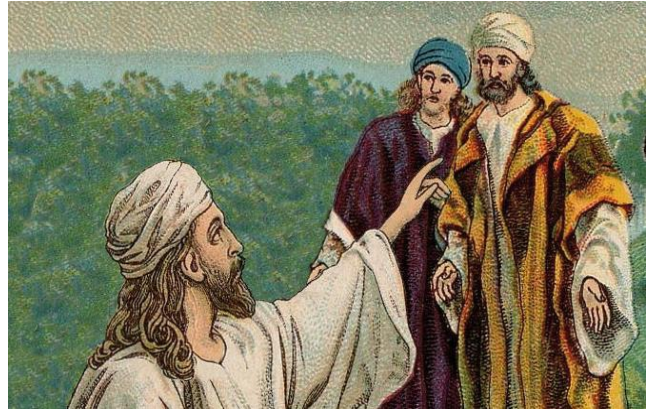

**Deacon's Corner
All Saints Day – November 1st**

All Saints Day will be celebrated on Friday, November 1. This holy day honors all the saints, known and unknown, who have entered into eternal life. All Saints' Day was instituted by Pope Boniface IV, who consecrated the Pantheon in Rome to the Virgin Mary and all the martyrs in May 609 A.D. The day was moved to November 1 by Pope Gregory III in the 8th century and dedicated to all the saints.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops defines saints as "persons in heaven (officially canonized or not), who lived heroically virtuous lives, offered their life for others, or were martyred for the faith, and who are worthy of imitation." The Gospel on this day is Jesus' Sermon on the Mount which focuses on the beatitudes. The eight beatitudes are the heart of Christ's teaching which describe "the fundamental attitudes and virtues for living as a faithful disciple of Jesus." They are those who are poor in spirit, who mourn, are meek, thirst for righteousness, are merciful, are pure of heart, are peacemakers, and are persecuted for righteousness.

When we strive to live the beatitudes, we build up the Kingdom of God in our world. Saint Teresa of Calcutta reminds us that "holiness is not the luxury of a few people, but a simple duty for you and me." We are all called to be saints. We can accomplish this by striving to follow God's commands and being united with Him in love. On this day, may we pray and ask the saints to pray for us in our lives.
