Mother Cabrini 40 Hours Devotion, November 10th 11th & 12th

This year, we are pleased to have with us, Fr. Jacob Carazo, OFM Conv. who is presently Associate Director of Post-Novitiate Formation in Silver Spring, MD. He was born in Cartagena, Colombia, South America in 1965, and immigrated to the United States with his family, settling in Southern California at the age of seven. He was working 6 years as a hospital nurse when he came to the Conventual Franciscan Friars in 1991. He professed his Vows August 2, 1994, in California for the Franciscan Province of St. Joseph of Cupertino. As a friar, he completed his BA in History at California State University in 1998, and his Theological studies at St. Bonaventure (Seraphicum) in Rome, in 2003. He was ordained to the Transitional Diaconate at the Basilica of the Twelve Apostles in Rome in April of 2003, and ordained to the Priesthood at St. Thomas Aquinas Cathedral in Reno, Nevada, May 29, 2004.

Friar Jacob has served as the Parochial Vicar of St. Thomas Aquinas Cathedral in Reno, Nevada, and in San Pablo, CA, 2003 – 2014, returning to Reno to serve as the Rector of the Cathedral from 2014 - 2018. He then became Pastor of St. Paul the Apostle Church in Pismo Beach, CA, until his present assignment, as of 2022. Fr. Jacob has a great interest in baseball, especially the LA Dodgers, and is an avid photographer. Fr. Jacob is proficient in Spanish, English, and Italian.

Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Deuteronomy 6:2-6

Moses commands the people to love and fear God, and always keep the commandments that they were given. He tells them to observe all statutes so that they will continue to grow and prosper, and tells them that they must love God with all their soul and strength.

Second Reading: Hebrews 7:23-28

Under the old covenant there were many priests, but Jesus will now remain high priest forever because he will live forever, and always be available to those who want to be saved. He does not need to offer sacrifice every day for the sins of his people, because he offered himself up in payment for their sins.

Gospel: Mark 12:28b-34

One of the scribes asked Jesus which commandment is the first, and he replied that the first is to love and honor the Lord and no one else. Jesus explained that they must love God with all their heart, and love their neighbor. The scribe agreed that loving God completely and loving one's neighbor is better than any sacrifice they could make.

The Memorial of Saint Charles Borromeo, Bishop

On Monday, November 4, the Memorial of Saint Charles Borromeo, Bishop is celebrated. He was born in a wealthy family in Milan, Italy in 1538. Charles desired to devoted himself to Church ministry. Pope Pius IV ordained him a cardinal and appointed him as the Administrator of the Archdiocese of Milan. He is credited with keeping the Council of Trent in session when it was on the verge of dissolving. The Council created the Roman Catechism and texts for liturgical works and hymns.

After the Council, St. Charles adopted a simple lifestyle and began to devote his time to the people in the Archdiocese of Milan. He adopted a series of reforms for the bishops and clergy. St. Charles founded many colleges and seminaries for the clergy. He also gave his wealth and resources to charity to support the poor. During the plague of 1576, he strived to feed 60,000 people daily, borrowing money that that took years for him to repay. When others in authority fled the city, St. Charles stayed and ministered to the sick and the poor.

St. Charles Borromeo saw Jesus Christ in his neighbors and believed that charity shown to the least of His flock was mercy done for Our Savior. May we have this same belief and act in concrete ways for people in need in our communities. St. Charles is the patron saint of catechists, catechumens, and seminarians.
