

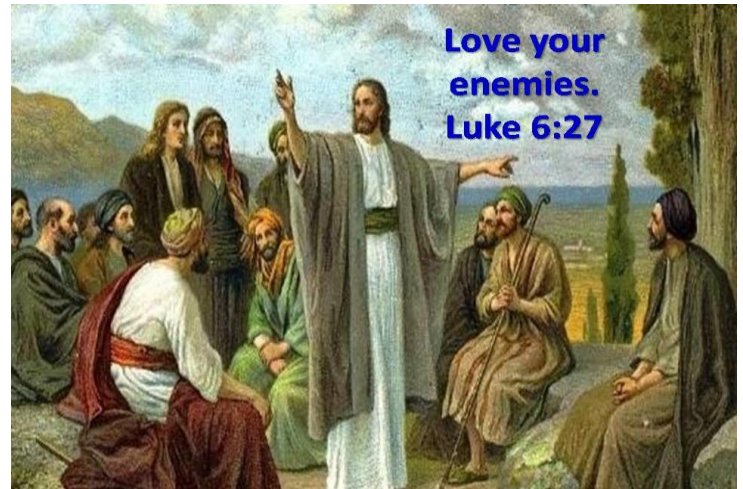

Deacon's Corner

On Tuesday, February 25 at daily mass, in the Holy Gospel of St. Mark, we will hear that Jesus and His disciples come to Capernaum. Jesus hears them arguing. He asks them what they were discussing. Christ knows they were talking about who was the greatest among them. Our Lord calls them together and says to His Apostles and to each one of us, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all" (9:30-37).

What does Jesus mean that we should "be the last of all and the servant of all?" In this spirit of service, Jesus asks us to love and serve one another. Love is desiring the good of another person. It encourages us to serve in humility and to extend ourselves in generosity and kindness. Serving one another is to see the face of Jesus in every person we encounter, especially in those who are most in need of our compassion.

One way we can be a servant to others is to practice the seven corporal works of mercy, simple everyday acts of kindness. These works are to feed the hungry, give water to thirsty, cloth the naked, shelter the homeless, visit the sick, visit the imprisoned, and bury the dead. There are many and varied ways to practice these works of mercy.

As we quietly reflect about this Gospel passage, may we ask ourselves, "Is my daily life focused on a concern for the good of others?" and "Do I engage in daily acts of service?"

Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: 1 Samuel 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23

Saul wanted to harm David and went into the desert to locate him. David and his companion Abishai visited Saul and his troops while they slept. Abishai wanted to kill Saul, but David would not allow it, as he refused to kill the Lord's anointed.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:45-49

Paul portrays Adam as the first physical man and Jesus as the first man to give us our spirituality. One man was formed from dust, the other sent down from heaven. Just as we resemble the first being physically, we should model ourselves after Jesus spiritually.

Gospel: Luke 6:27-38

Jesus explains that loving only people who love us is no great achievement. He also reminds us that doing a favor for someone while expecting something in return is not what he asks of us. Instead, we should emulate God by being compassionate and non-judgmental, even towards individuals who hate and mistreat us.
