DEACON'S CORNER

Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary

As Church, we celebrate the Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary on Monday, October 7. The Holy Rosary originated in 1212 when Saint Dominic de Guzman saw a vision of the Virgin Mary who gave him the rosary. It was in response to his prayer to understand how to combat the Albigensian heresy. The defeat of this heresy led many people to view the rosary in finding strength, and confidence in facing life's difficulties.

This feast day also commemorates the Holy League's defeat of the Ottoman Empire in the Battle of Lepanto in 1571. Although the Turkish forces were powerful, they were not able to advance into Europe. The Christians won due to the intercession of Our Lady and the prayers of the Most Holy Rosary. Today, people who pray the rosary accept it as a way given by the Blessed Mother to contemplate about Jesus Christ and His loving presence in our lives. In her apparitions at Lourdes and Fatima, Our Lady encouraged us to say the rosary daily to overcome the "disturbances in our hearts, to strengthen the relationships in our families, and to heal the relations among all people." Pope St John Paul II called the rosary a "Christocentric prayer" containing the Gospel message in its entirety.

On this feast day, may we pray, "Hail, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death.
