

Deacon's Corner Fourth Sunday of Lent

During this fourth week of Lent, in the Gospel of St. Luke on Sunday, Jesus tells the people and us the beautiful parable of the Prodigal Son. In this story, we hear that the youngest son asks his father for his inheritance. After he receives it, he leaves his father's home and lives a reckless lifestyle. When the money runs out, he comes home and begs his father to take him in as a servant. The father sees his son returning down the road and overwhelmed with joy, the father forgives him before his son opens his mouth.

Lent is a time of change, repentance, and asking for forgiveness for one's mistakes in daily life. In this Gospel story, the father represents God and His total love for each one of us. Our Father is always ready to forgive us. His love for us is eternal. Nothing will ever destroy His love for us because God is love. As God is always willing to forgive us, He asks that we love on another and forgive others. Through God's grace, forgiveness is an act of our will in making a conscious decision to become free of anger, resentment, and grudges against another person.

As we continue our Lenten journey this week, may we pray about two spiritual questions: "How will I open my life to God's forgiving love?" and "To whom am I called this day to be an instrument of God's love and forgiveness?"

March 30, 2025 Fourth Sunday of Lent

First Reading: Joshua 5:9a, 10-12

Joshua and the Israelites celebrated Passover in Jericho. This was the first time they had eaten the produce of the promised land. After this, there was no more bread sent from heaven because they were able to eat the yield of the land.

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:17-21

Paul tells us that anyone living in Jesus is a new creation because God has reconciled with us through Christ. As an ambassador for Jesus, Paul implores that the Corinthians be reconciled to God through Jesus.

Gospel: Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

The Pharisees grew disgusted with Jesus because of his compassion toward sinners. So Jesus told them a story of a son who squandered his inheritance. When a famine broke out, he returned home and asked his father to become a hired hand. His father instead welcomed him with a joyful celebration, just as God is overjoyed when a sinner returns to him.
