





THE MOST HOLY BODY AND **BLOOD OF CHRIST (Corpus Christi)**

First Reading: Exodus 24:3-8

Moses explained to the people the commandments he had received from God. Upon hearing them, the entire community immediately agreed they would do as God had told them. Moses then sacrificed young bulls and sprinkled the people with their blood, calling it the blood of the covenant they had made.

Second Reading: Hebrews 9:11-15

Jesus did not offer God the blood of sacrifices, but instead he offered up his own blood to cleanse all people of the transgressions they had committed under the first covenant with God. Christ instead brought a new covenant, which, if kept, would lead to eternal life.

Gospel: Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

Jesus sent two of his disciples to prepare the Passover supper. During the meal he blessed bread and offered it to them saying, "This is my body." He then offered them wine and called it his blood, "the blood of the covenant, to be poured out on behalf of many."

DEACON'S CORNER The Solemnity of The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

The Solemnity of Most Sacred Heart of Jesus will be celebrated on Friday, June 7. In 1856, Pope Pius IX instituted this feast on the universal Roman calendar to be celebrated the Friday after the Corpus Christi octave. The central message of this solemnity is the everlasting love and mercy that flows from Jesus' heart for all of humanity.

St. Pope John II said, "This feast reminds us of the mystery of the love of God for the people of all time." He explained, "The Sacred Heart has given us everything — redemption, salvation, sanctification." As we approach Christ in the mystery of His heart, we are able to focus on the great mystery of our faith, that God is love. It also encourages us to imitate Jesus' love and to offer mercy to others through our daily actions. From the Sacred Heart of Jesus, our hearts learn humility, love, and mercy.

On this solemnity, may we pray, "Divine Heart of Jesus, I offer you through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, Mother of the Church, in union with the Eucharistic Sacrifice, my prayers, actions, joys and sufferings of this day in reparation for sins and for the salvation of all people, in the grace of the Holy Spirit for the glory of the Heavenly Father. Amen."
