If you will recall, Friar Rich was here for his Apostolic Year back in 2020. He came back to Mother Cabrini to celebrate one of his first Masses with us last Sunday at the 11AM Mass. Friar

Rich was ordained into the priesthood on Saturday, June 8th at St. Casimir Church, Baltimore Maryland.

Friar Richard said "after I was ordained a Deacon, I saw Holy Orders as being given the grace and mission to serve the Church in a particular way: to proclaim the gospel, to teach, to preach, to baptize. It was a calling to be "for them" in a special way. Now, as I receive Holy Orders as a priest, the meaning is still the same, but the mission's scope is broadening. I will still be called to proclaim the Gospel, teach, preach, and baptize. But added to that will be the grace and mission to feed the Church through the Eucharist, and to heal it through reconciliation and anointing."

DEACON'S CORNER

The Feast of St. Thomas the Apostle

The Feast of St. Thomas the Apostle will be celebrated on Wednesday, July 3. St. Thomas was one of the original Twelve Apostles. Little is known about his life. However, from the Gospel of John, we see that St. Thomas is inquisitive and asks Jesus questions about faith. He has faith in Christ and the courage to seek a deeper understanding by approaching Our Lord.

In the Gospel of St. John, Jesus has a discussion with His Apostles at the Last Supper. Jesus speaks these words, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If there were not, would I have told you that I am going to prepare a place for you? . . . Where I am going you know the way." Thomas said to him, "Master, we do not know where you are going; how can we know the way?" Jesus said to him, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." (14:1-6)

We can be grateful to St. Thomas for asking this question and learning one of the great teachings and core truths of our faith. On his feast day, may we pray, "Lord Jesus, grant me the faith of St. Thomas, to trust in Your presence, to seek Your truth, and to believe with all my heart that You are my Lord. Amen."
