

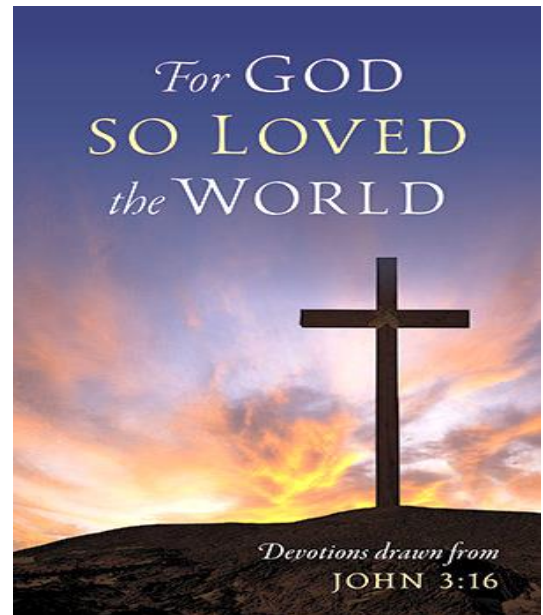

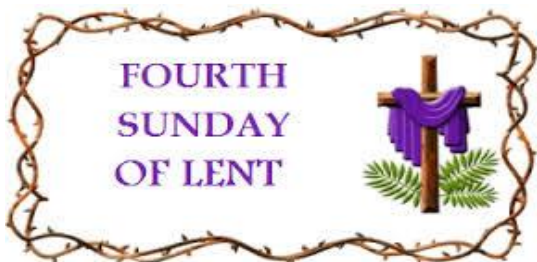


Got Old Palms. . . ???

Fourth Sunday of Lent

First Reading: 2 Chronicles 36:14-16, 19-23

The people of Judah practiced many abominations, even polluting God's temple in Jerusalem. They mocked the messengers he sent among them, until he grew so angry he delivered them to the King of the Chaldeans. Those who weren't killed were exiled and became servants for seventy years. Cyrus, King of Persia, was ordered to build a temple to God in Jerusalem, and he freed the servants as God had inspired him to do.

Second Reading: Ephesians 2:4-10

Paul declares that God brought us to life in Jesus, though we had been dead from our sins. He reminds us that it was not a reward for our good service so no one should take credit. Instead, we must remember that it was not our doing, but a sign of God's mercy and love for us.

Gospel: John 3:14-21

God so loved the world, he sent us his only Son so that all who believed would have eternal life in him. The light came into the world, but those who were wicked avoided it, for fear that their evil deeds would be exposed. But those who believed were unafraid of the light, where it would be clear that their deeds were done in God.

Deacon's Corner

This week is the Fourth Week in Lent. This Sunday is traditionally known as Laetare Sunday, from the Latin word meaning "rejoice." As the people of God, we rejoice in anticipation of the Glorious Resurrection of Jesus Christ, Our Savior, on Easter Sunday and His victory over sin and death. In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus tells Nicodemus that the Son of Man will be raised up and those who believe in Him will have eternal life. This message is the Good News and the reason to rejoice in this season of Lent and in our lives.

Jesus, Our Savior, loves us and is willing to sacrifice His life for us on the Holy Cross.
